About Care Coordinators

A care coordinator, also known as a patient care coordinator, patient navigator, or resident care coordinator, helps patients through the complex elements of the behavioral healthcare system. If you are an excellent communicator, a good listener, and willing to empathize with your patient, this growing allied healthcare field is for you.

Typical duties may include:

- Patient screening and scheduling.
- Communicating with the patient and care team.
- Meeting with patients and family members to inform and educate them on the patient's condition and plan of care.
- Coordinating with insurance carriers.
- Reviewing medication inventory and processing pharmacy orders.
- Performing patient case management tasks.
- Locating and providing community resources to patients and their family members.

- Employment for this occupation is projected to grow 13 percent from 2018 to 2028.
- The annual median range for care coordinators varies from \$35,060 to \$44,020, depending on your area of specialty.
- Each program is offered online and takes between 6-12 months to complete.

Earning a certificate as a care coordinator is a great way to advance your career. The certificate also provides flexible upskilling opportunities for existing credentialed healthcare workers.

Minimum Qualifications


• Have 3+ years of experience in your current/recent health role and a valid healthcare license or credential.
