WILL THERE BE ENOUGH HEALTHCARE WORKERS TO TAKE CARE OF THEM?





By 2050, California's population is projected to reach 45 million people, and the total number of adults aged 65 and older is projected to grow by 4 million, with an increase of 87% from 2012 by 2030.¹



The U.S. will need to hire 2.8 million new healthcare workers by 2025 in order to adequately take care of its aging population. But a persistent shortage of skilled workers will mean hundreds of thousands of positions will remain unfilled.²
