#### Friends,

As part of the G7 Leaders' Summit Kananaskis, I am pleased to welcome you to Calgary for this inaugural global forum on Responsible Gaming and Gambling Policy, part of the G7 Canada Brain Economy Summit.

I especially want to thank Almond Digital Health, Kindbridge Behavioral Health, Everi Holdings, the International Center for Responsible Gaming (ICRG), the Responsible Gambling Council (RGC), and the Canadian Gaming Association for their leadership and collaboration in helping to convene industry and public sector partners for this effort.

Gambling has long been part of everyday life, a source of entertainment, connection, and economic activity. It is not inherently harmful, nor should it be treated as such. However, as gambling becomes increasingly embedded in digital environments and everyday experiences, we must recognize that without responsible stewardship, it can contribute to behavioral addiction, mental health challenges, and societal and economic strain, particularly among youth.

New technologies, from loot boxes in video games to generative Al-driven marketing and gambling experiences, are further blurring the lines between entertainment, gaming, and gambling, often introducing risk at younger ages and in less regulated settings. These are multinational challenges. Taken together, these trends make coordinated action even more urgent.

Brain capital provides a powerful lens to address this complexity. By viewing the health and development of our brains as critical national assets and drivers of our economies, we can build policies that protect individual flourishing while preserving economic resilience and societal well-being. This approach supports gambling as a positive form of entertainment while safeguarding against its potential harms in a rapidly evolving technological landscape.

This initiative is formally aligned with the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) and with G7 Canada, G20 South Africa, and World Economic Forum (WEF) Brain Economy Action Forum priorities around brain health, human capital, and economic resilience. The recommendations produced through this forum will also inform work underway in the United States through the National Council of Legislators from Gaming States (NCLGS), further connecting global and domestic efforts.

As leaders gathered here, we have the opportunity to draw up a practical and coordinated global framework for Responsible Gaming and Gambling Policy. The recommendations you shape through this three-part series - across the G7 Canada (June 13-14th), UNGA (September 25-26th), and WEF (Jan 2026) - will be formally presented through policy channels, helping to define the next generation of international policy on public health, youth protection, innovation, and societal prosperity.


