About Patient Care Representatives

Patient Care Representatives (PCR) collaborate with healthcare professionals to improve care quality. A PCR may schedule follow-up appointments; screen/monitor patients using questions about mental health or other issues; keep track of records, statistics, and data bases; and more.

PCRs are also known as:

- · Patient Care Advocate
- · Panel Manager
- Medicaid Service Coordinator (MSC)
- · Patient Access Coordinator or Specialist

Fast Facts about the Futuro Health Program:

- This is an 8-week program designed for allied health professionals who have a year of working experience in a patient-facing role.
- Participants who are accepted will be able to attend tuition-free thanks to Futuro Health scholarships.
- To ensure commitment and completion, participants are required to pay a one-time \$100 non-refundable registration fee.

- The ability to work in the U.S.
