Futuro Health is addressing the nation's critical shortage in allied healthcare workers and has shared its best practices at forums of the World Health Organization (WHO), National Governors Association (NGA) and the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

Ton-Quinlivan is chairperson and an appointee of Governor Newsom to the Health Workforce Education and Training Council responsible for coordinating California's health workforce education and training to meet the state's needs, with an emphasis on health equity and inclusive workforce participation. Ton-Quinlivan was named a White House Champion of Change under the Obama administration in recognition of her notable career in industry, education, and service as a community leader. She serves on the boards of the National Student Clearinghouse and Silicon Valley Community Foundation and is a member of the International Women's Forum. In addition to her leadership roles, Ton-Quinlivan is a podcast host and author of best-seller book, WorkforceRx: Inclusive and Agile Strategies for Employers, Educators and Workers During Unsettled Times.
